At our September meeting it was nice to see David Davies with us – especially so that he was able to give us an update on the Headley Court Development. Neil Marshall visited the complex during the summer and submitted the following report for your information.



"The Lodges at Chester-le-Street have supported *Help for Heroes* for some time and I thought it might be nice to see the outcome of our efforts.

The charity was originally set up to provide a therapy swimming pool at Headley Court, the military recuperation centre for injured personnel. Headley Court is a large country house and gardens, in the South of England, that was donated to the military after WW1, and whilst the house had been updated the patients had to use the local public swimming baths for therapy.

Without going into detail this was not satisfactory so the project to build a swimming pool was started. ..... continued
